Funeral services for Howard Thies, 94 of Pin Oak, Texas, were held Thursday, December 15, 2022 at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Pin Oak with Father Miguel Duarte officiating. Burial took place in the church cemetery.

**Howard John Thies** was born on June 11, 1928 in Chicago, Illinois to Paul and Willette (Earnhart) Thies. He grew up in Illinois before moving to Houston when he was seventeen years old. He graduated from Reagan High School in Houston and received his Associate Degree from the University of Houston. Howard joined the United States Army on October 4, 1950 and served during the Korean Conflict before receiving his

Honorable Discharge on October 4, 1952 having obtained the rank of Private First Class.

On June 30, 1956, he was united in marriage to Rose Marie Richter at St. Margaret Catholic Church in Giddings. They were blessed with five children, Annette, Marian, Sharon, John, and Karen.

He completed many maintenance projects at the church and was always willing to do whatever needed to be done, including refinishing nearly every pew in the sanctuary. Howard was mechanically gifted and spent many hours working on cars and knew everything about them. He had a deep love for history, especially the World War II era. Avid dancers, Howard and Rose were members of the Polka Lovers Club of America for over 25 years. More than anything, he enjoyed the time he was able to spend with his family, especially the past sixty-six years with his beloved wife, Rose.

Howard passed away peacefully in the arms of his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, during the early morning hours of Saturday, December 10, 2022 in Sugar Land, Texas.

**Armand H. Hollas,** passed away peacefully in the early hours of Saturday, Jan. 21, 2023. He was 91 years old. Funeral services were held on Thursday, Jan. 26, 2023 at 11 a.m. at St. Mary's Catholic Church in High Hill, with visitation starting at 9 a.m. and rosary at 10:30 a.m. Interment with full military honors by the Schulenburg

Armand was born at home on the family farm in High Hill on Sept. 7, 1931. He was the second of seven strong sons born to Hugo Sr. and Pauline (Schmidt) Hollas. After completing his education at Middle Creek School, Armand went to work the family farm full-time. Despite the hard work of being a subsistence farmer, Armand found time to pursue his passion of playing baseball on the The Herder Truckers and MG Feeders. He often rode his bike five miles to town (after working the farm all day) to catch a ride to games in Hallettsville and other area communities. Many old timers in the area still say he was one of the best.

In 1950 Armand volunteered for service in the U.S. Army and spent two years proudly serving in the elite Military Police Command at Fort Lewis, Washington. He served an additional eight years as an Army Reserve in the Texas Military District, receiving his Honorable Discharge in December 1960. After leaving Fort Lewis, Armand returned to Schulenburg where he married the love of his life, Mildred Hilscher, on April 24, 1955. The couple moved to Houston where they were parishioners at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church. In August 1956, their son, Gerald was born, and daughter Janice followed in 1959, completing this incredible family. During this time, he was working for Houston Natural Gas as well as Rupley Tire, while attending The University of Houston. He graduated in 1960 with a bachelor's degree in accounting, attained his CPA and landed a position in the auditing department of Magabar Industries. He was promoted to International Tax Manager and retired after 22 years as the Comptroller of Dresser Industries in 1986.

Armand bought two acres in High Hill, where he built his dream home. Mildred retired from Shell Oil in 1992 and they made High Hill their permanent residence. Moving back home gave Armand the time to do what he thoroughly enjoyed, becoming an entrepreneur. He opened a used car dealership and purchased several rental properties while running Beef Master cattle on the farm. Armand enjoyed maintaining the farm and its equipment. He was a world class tinkerer and modifier.

Armand loved his wife, children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. He possessed solid core values, honesty (sometimes brutal), morals, a strong work ethic, compassion, charity, dedication to duties and respect to all who would listen. Armand had a big heart and continued to give back to his community by serving on the Parish Councils of St. Rose of Lima and St. Pius X High School in Houson, the Chamber of Commerce and MHMR in Schulenburg, also the Knights of Columbus and the St. Joseph's Society.

Armand and Mildred had a passion for polka dancing. They belonged to the Polka Lovers Club of America where they were the King and Queen in 1996 and held various offices in the Club. They literally danced around the world. He was dedicated to keeping alive and preserving the history of polka dancing, by being a founding member and officer in the Polka Lovers Club of Texas Museum in La Grange.

**DID YOU KNOW** in 1957, The Ray Baca Band lost their solo trumpeter Gus Lindeman, left, to play with the Blume Orchestra. Ray Baca went to La Grange High School to seek an immediate replacement. Since Rod was the lead trumpet in the La Grange High School band at that time, Ray asked if he could try out. As a high school senior, that was a great chance to earn "big" money, maybe \$10 a night, so he tried out and was playing with Mr. Ray soon thereafter. He learned to sing some Czech songs and was the "token" German. He joyfully played with Ray Baca Orchestra on weekends for the next four years while he was in college. The photo is the Ray Baca Orchestra playing at Freyburg Dance Hall near Schulenburg, with the young trumpet player, Rod Koenig, who started with the band that week and stayed with them for 5 years until Don Cernosek took over for him!
