

Polka Lovers Club of Texas Museum receives charitable donation from the Family of Leland and Alice Schroeder

Leland and Alice Schroeder from Franklin, Texas, married in 1948 and moved to Houston, where they raised their family. They loved to dance the Polka, Waltz, and Two-Step; and ensured their children followed in their dancing footsteps. While they enjoyed dancing in their youth, this activity grew exponentially upon retirement. Over the years, they joined multiple dance "clubs" – dance halls with an annual membership, including clubs in Industry, Cameron, Shelby and Buckholts. They also threw their own party dances and invited many of their friends. They and their children held dances for special occasions, such as their 50th wedding anniversary. After many years of enjoying dances, their physical limitations restricted their ability to dance. However, age did not stop them from dancing in the kitchen, living room or Lee's office while listening to polka time radio shows.

Leland Schroeder passed away on April 26, 2020, at the age of 96. He attended school in Needville and graduated from Richmond High School in 1943. He served in the U.S. Army's Infantry 75th Division from 1943 to 1946 to the rank of First Sergeant, and in 2019 received the French Legion of Honor medal for his WWII military service, thus designating him as a Knight of France. He attended the University of Houston. He worked for Central Freight Lines in Houston for 44 years as a dock worker, billing clerk, office manager and for many years as terminal manager.

Alice Anna Jurca Schroeder passed away December 20, 2020, at the age of 93. She attended school in Needville and graduated from Richmond High School in 1945. Ms. Schroeder instilled values of spirituality, honesty and hard work that became engrained in her six children. She was highly committed to charity work and made it a priority by dedicating significant time and effort to others in need by practicing faith hope and charity. Alice was awarded a medal of volunteerism by the St. Christopher's Church in Houston recognizing her leadership and dedication to her ministry of visiting those in nursing homes and the home-bound.



OLD TIME BREAD PUDDING

2 cups of old bread ½ cup sugar
1 cup evaporated milk
1 cup boiling water
2 eggs
½ tsp. salt
1 tsp. vanilla
1/3 cup raisins



Bake in moderate slow oven 350 degrees for 30 minutes, or until knife inserted in center comes out clean.

Another 'very good' cake recipe from a member of the Texas Extension Education Association:

1 - box Duncan Hines Butter Recipe Yellow Cake Mix

1/2 cup coconut

1/2 cup oleo

1 can of sliced peaches or apples

1/2 cup sugar

tsp. cinnamon

⊥ egg

1 cup of sour cream

Mix and crumble first three (3) ingredients and pat onto an oblong pan sprayed with Pam and bake for about 8-10 minutes at 350 degrees.

Removed from oven, arrange fruit slices over above. Sprinkle ½ cup of sugar and 1 tsp. cinnamon over mixture.

Beat egg with sour cream and dribble over mixture.

Bake about 15 to 25 minutes at 350 degrees.

2 - 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese (softened)

3/4 cup sugar

2 eggs

1 Tablespoon lemon juice

2 teaspoon vanilla

Beat cream cheese, sugar, eggs, lemon juice, and vanilla till light and fluffy.
